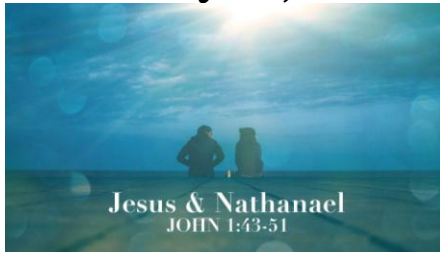

### **There will be a two day food packaging event**

at St. Andrew Lutheran Church, 175 Downeast Highway in Ellsworth

### **Friday, January 19 and Saturday, January 20.**

This is a great opportunity for people of all ages to come together and package healthy non-perishable meals that are distributed to food pantries in Washington and Hancock Counties (including the Westside Food Pantry).

A quarter pays for one serving; \$1.50 for a package that feeds 6 people. Our goal is at least 40,000 meals (\$10,000). Donations are needed plus lots of volunteers for the 19th and 20th!

The volunteer goal is at least 4 assembly lines working - which is 40 - 48 people at any given time See schedule below.

### **The Details/Schedule...**

**On Friday, January 19 we will be working from noon to 6;** *with noon being unload and set up time. Again, as many heavy lifters as possible for the first hour or so would be fantastic.*

**On Saturday, January 20 we will be working from 9 - 1 (Or noon or 2 depending on the number and speed of volunteers!)**

**We will have 4 assembly lines available - so can accommodate 40 -50 volunteers at a time. Some jobs can be done seated; others require standing; and a few heavy lifters are always needed.**

**The sign up sheet for workers is on the easel in the narthex.**

**This is a great project for younger folks; High school students can use this project for their community service hours.**
